

More Awards for new White Bay Cruise Terminal

The White Bay Cruise Terminal won three categories at the 2014 NSW Architecture Awards.

This makes for four accolades for the building since winning the World Architecture Festival Award in the Transport category in October 2013 in Singapore. The Terminal's innovative design received praise from judges of the Public Architecture Award, Sustainable Architecture Award and the Colorbond Award for Steel Architecture.

The terminal was delivered by the Barangaroo Delivery Authority (BDA) and Sydney Ports.

Sydney Ports CEO Grant Gilfillan said the project team should be justifiably proud of this latest industry recognition.

"BDA convinced us to embrace a more design-led approach and their role in supporting delivery of the new cruise terminal has been rewarding for us both.

"The \$57 million White Bay Cruise Terminal provides new capacity for Sydney's booming tourism maritime industry and is expected to welcome more than 400,000 visitors and 170 vessels each year," Mr Gilfillan said.

Designed by Johnson Pilton Walker, the architecture draws upon the heritage of White Bay's industrial foreshore, with adaptive re-use of the original steel trussed columns and overhead gantry rails used back in the 70's when the area was a busy container terminal.

The design features a unique wave-form roof canopy that provides a flexible, bright and airy space suitable for a wide range of uses and creates an iconic, welcoming and memorable arrival experience for cruise visitors.
