NEARLY 10,000 SYDNEYSIDERS HAVE NOW VIEWED PLANS FOR BARANGAROO

Thousands of people from across Sydney have now viewed plans for the creation of the city's newest precinct, Barangaroo.

Many more are expected to attend a series of public workshops to be held all over Sydney in the next month including Parramatta and Caringbah.

"The fact that nearly 10,000 people have now viewed the plans, either in person or online, is a testament to the public engagement program we are undertaking", said Barangaroo Delivery Authority CEO John Tabart.

"People from all over the city and beyond are genuinely interested in learning about what is planned for Barangaroo and how they can contribute to shaping the 22 hectare precinct.

"To date we have had 3000 visit our display centre in person and a further 6500 have logged on to view the display online.

"In addition some 200 people attended the first of four public workshops which are taking Barangaroo to the community.

"Monday night's heard from internationally renowned planner, Professor Jan Gehl, who is working with Barangaroo Delivery Authority to ensure that our public spaces are designed to encourage users and activity.

"Participants contributed a range of important comments and views during the session which are being fed into the design process.

"Three other workshops will be conducted during May including one at Parramatta and one at Caringbah.

"These workshops offer a unique opportunity for people no matter where they live, to contribute to the real detail of Barangaroo so I strongly encourage interested people to participate", said Mr. Tabart.

These forums are a continuation of the information and consultation process that commenced in December 2009, with the announcement of Lend Lease developer for Barangaroo South. All of these forums are prior to any formal applications by Lend Lease to the Department of Planning, which will require a formal planning process including public exhibition and seeking submissions, prior to consideration by the Minister for Planning.
