Barangaroo Public Display extended until 31 March

Following high levels of public interest, the Barangaroo Public Display has been extended until 31 March.

Since its opening on 24 February, approximately 1,600 people have visited the display, which features information on the winning Lend Lease scheme for the southern commercial precinct of Barangaroo, as well as the runner up plan by Brookfield Multiplex.

The display, which was originally scheduled to close on 20 March, also features information on the approved Concept Plan Modification for the Headland Park and Northern Cove, and milestones for the delivery of this new waterfront precinct.

The display will be open for three final viewings, on Wednesday 24 and 31 March from 12pm to 7pm, and Saturday 27 March from 9am to 5pm. In addition, the display will be available to view online at www.barangaroo.com/display.

The public display is an initiative of the Barangaroo Delivery Authority. It does not form part of the statutory planning process for Barangaroo. Development applications for all works will be submitted to the Department of Planning and placed on exhibition for public comment in coming months.
